



Get more money back from the IRS!

If your family earned less than \$52,427 last year, you may qualify for over \$6,000 in credit or cash back from the IRS through the Earned Income Tax Credit (EITC).

You can qualify even if you don't owe taxes, but you must file a tax return and claim the credit to get it. Here are the basics:

Qualifying Children	Single (Earned income and adjusted gross income limit)	Married and Filing Jointly (Earned income and adjusted gross income limit)	Tax Year 2015 Maximum Credit
No Child	\$14,590	\$20,020	\$496
One Child	\$38,511	\$43,941	\$3,305
Two Children	\$43,756	\$49,186	\$5,460
Three or More	\$46,997	\$52,427	\$6,143

Eligibility is based on several factors, but 4 out of 5 applicants usually receive the credit. Use the IRS's online EITC Assistant at www.irs.gov/eitc to see if you qualify. (A Spanish version is also available.)

You earned it. Now file, claim, and get it.

Free Tax Return Preparation Assistance

The IRS Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) and the Tax Counseling for the Elderly (TCE) programs offer free help for taxpayers who qualify.

Trained volunteers can help with special credits, such as the Earned Income Tax Credit, Child Tax Credit, and Credit for the Elderly or the Disabled. Most sites also offer free electronic filing (e-filing) for faster refunds.
